





The importance of laws, whether they be those that govern the class, school or country, are consistently reinforced throughout regular school days and through school assemblies. The children are taught right from wrong. Each family signs the Whole School Agreement which includes the Code of Conduct as well as other linking themes. Within school, pupils are actively encouraged to make choices, knowing that they are in a safe and supportive environment. As a school we educate and provide boundaries for pupils to make choices safely, through the provision of a safe environment and empowering education. Pupils are encouraged to know, understand and exercise their rights and personal freedoms and advice how to exercise these safely, for example through our E-Safety and PSHE lessons. Whether it be through choice of challenge, of how they record, of participation in our numerous extra-curricular clubs, pupils are given the freedom to make choices. All classes work towards incentives such as Golden Time where their choices affect outcomes for themselves personally as well as the class. We also try to give ownership of learning to the children and promote a personal investigative approach.
